Where We've Been, Where We're Going

The twelve months of 2017 brought rapid, exciting growth for the Me Fine Foundation. This was because of the generosity and encouragement from supporters like you. We helped more families than ever (211 unique families) through financial assistance and hundreds more through our sponsorship of key emotional and social support Dear Friend, programs. We also expanded our offerings, including a new resource cart dedicated exclusively to teenage patients.

Thanks to significant investments from key funders, we announced Me Fine's first-ever expansion during our 2017 gala. Now, we are also serving NICU families at WakeMed Children's Hospital. This increase in funding also allowed us to turn two part-time staff positions into full-time opportunities, which has already reaped a multitude of benefits for Me Fine's capacity, fundraising efforts, and programmatic impact in the first six months of this year.

Because of the tireless work of those who came before, we no longer need to ask ourselves: How can we build Me Fine to be a viable organization? Based on the 2017 impact reports and anecdotal reflections from hospital partners, donors, and community members, it is clear that Me Fine's mission to support critically ill children and families is viable. Now our question is: How we can ensure sustainability?

Families will continue to experience financial crisis. Families will continue to require strategic social and emotional interventions to help process their experiences, tell their stories, and build connections with others going through similar experiences. Our task now is to develop that clear road map to ensure Me Fine has the resources, skills, and infrastructure to meet the ever-growing needs and move the work forward in meaningful, significant ways.

Thank you for your willingness to join us on that journey. Thank you for channeling your compassion into contributions that allowed more families to be together, and more stable, during such unimaginable times.



Your Impact in 2017

Family Financial Assistance Program



From January 1 through December 31, Me Fine Foundation provided \$80,640 in financial assistance to 211 unique families. Rent and mortgage expenses topped the list of greatest need (28.1% of total financial assistance) followed by vehicle expenses (22.1%), utility bills (19.1%), and hospital parking (6.7%). Other requests that Me Fine filled included gift cards for groceries, gas cards, baby needs, funeral expenses, and household needs.

Additionally, families at Me Fine's partner hospitals received \$37,600 worth of in-kind donations. These included toys, puzzles, games, art supplies, and other pediatric patient-specific items during Christmas in July and Hope for the Holidays.














Your Impact in 2017 Social Support Programs







Each child selects an age-appropriate toy thanks to the generous in-kind support Me Fine receives during our Hope for the Holidays program and other toy drives held throughout the year.

All NICU families receive a Care Package containing specific items for their babies' special needs, including a muslin blanket, a toy rattle, a gas card, and a parking pass to help offset the costs of daily parking.

Your Impact in 2017



by Gabe's My Heart, a nonprofit based in Nashville, Tennessee, to assist children and families living with childhood cancer. According to its website, "since 2004, Gabe's My Heart has provided more than 27,000 Chemo Ducks to children across the country. Gabe's My Heart continues to develop therapeutic tools for the Gabe's Chemo Duck Program to enable hospital staff and parents to better prepare children for chemotherapy and eliminate the fear of the unknown."

The Me Fine Foundation funds Gabe's Chemo Ducks to ensure all pediatric patients diagnosed with cancer at Duke and UNC Children's Hospitals received this educational and therapeutic stuffed duck. Chemo Duck's role is to be a part of the child's medical team, making the child feel better and allowing them to see how their own medicine will be delivered into their body, whether through a port or a central line.



NICU Lunch & Learn

Parents whose infants are hospitalized in the Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) may skip meals in order to spend more time with their child. If parents and caregivers spend the entire day at the hospital, they have to pay out-of-pocket for food from the cafeteria or bring in their own food, which is another

expense.

Long hours in the NICU can be isolating: Voices must be muted and parents in need of encouragement or support may feel uncomfortable interrupting another from their own precious time with baby.

To encourage NICU parents to build connections for mutual support, and provide free, fresh food, Me Fine began funding monthly meals at Duke and UNC Children's Hospitals. Hospital staff members use these regular gatherings to talk with parents about different issues they may encounter with a NICU infant. Parents have a chance to catch their breath and connect with others who are likely asking similiar questions and experiencing the same worries. Parents and caregivers who participated are incredibly grateful for that time of fellowship.

Your Impact in 2017



Beads of Courage

We can tell our stories without uttering a single word. The Beads of Courage program offers exactly that gift to patients, siblings, and parents. Beads of Courage is an Arizona-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit that provides "innovative, arts-in-medicine supportive care programs for children coping with serious illness, their families and the health care providers who care for them."

Participating patients receive a colorful glass bead for every poke, prick, and procedure experienced during their treatment. Siblings and parents are also encouraged to participate, with corresponding beads to show their unique challenges and achievements while witnessing the treatment of their loved one. The Me Fine Foundation even has its own special bead! Each patient who chooses to participate in Beads of Courage receives their own starter pack, which includes the Me Fine bead as well as a note explaining how these beads can help them record, share, and own their unique medical story.

We feel fortunate to be able to fund this vital emotional support program at our partner hospitals, and we look forward to expanding the impact to siblings at Duke Children's in 2018.

Teen Resource Cart

Our partners at Duke Children's made us aware of a gap in resources that they were experiencing; teens lack age-appropriate resources for distraction and play while at they are undergoing treatment. We reached out to our partners at the A.J. Fletcher Foundation, and thanks to a generous grant, Me Fine was able to launch a new Teen Resource Cart for patients at Duke Children's Hospital!

Our **2017 Gala**, took place at City Club of Raleigh on September 23rd, and raised more than

\$210,000!

The Gala, presented by Centrifuge Media, celebrated Me Fine's accomplishments over the last year and served as a thank you to the amazing team of donors, allies, and advocates who had a hand in that success. The many local businesses that sponsored the event ensured a magical evening for all in attendance. The Gala is Me Fine's signature annual fundraiser, generating nearly a third of our annual operating revenue.

The live portion of the evening kicked off with the announcement that the organization would be launching our first expansion in 2018, beginning services at WakeMed Children's Hospital in the hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

The annual "Hero for Life" award is a staple of the Gala program. It recognizes an individual who goes above and beyond to help critically ill kids and families, specifically with respect to Me Fine's mission. Jordan Wright, a two-time cancer survivor and longtime Foundation ally, received the 2017 honor for his long-time willingness to donate his time and talents as a professional photographer.

Local media maven and longtime Triangle resident **Sharon Delaney McCloud served as the keynote speaker** during the program. Sharon gave first-hand experience of her family's struggle with pediatric illness, sharing the story of her daughter Macie and relating how Me Fine strengthens families in similar life and death situations.

Partners + Events = Major Impact

In order to provide the resources families need to be fully present with their sick child, the organization also relies on the generosity of community partners who elect to support Me Fine's mission through fundraising or awareness events.



In 2017, Love Is Bald, another 501(c)3 nonprofit, selected Me Fine to be the beneficiary of proceeds from its 3rd annual Susan S. Allen Memorial Golf Tournament, Love is Bald was launched in 2010 in honor and memory of Peyton Dergay, to raise money for cancer patients and their families.





Also, the Junior Women's League of Smithfield partnered with Me Fine for their September "Touch-A-Truck" event. JWL Smithfield has been an ally of Me Fine's for some time, often serving in various volunteer and fundraising capacities. In 2017, the event brought in a record \$7,500 that benefitted Me Fine families.

Last year, nearly 10,000 items were donated to Second Hope Shop from January 1 to December 31!





Me Fine's second-hand retail operation had an unprecedented year in 2017. The Second Hope Shop's annual top line revenue was up over 39% from the year prior, and net revenues contributed nearly \$40,000 back toward our ability to provide hope to children and families at our partner hospitals. 


