Your Impact in 2018 Family Financial Assistance Program

benefited from financial support

From January 1 through December 31, Me Fine Foundation **provided financial assistance to 286 unique families**. The greatest need for families was utility bill assistance (25.7%) followed by rent and mortgage expenses (24.8%); vehicle expenses (11.9%); and hospital parking (9.1%). Other requests that Me Fine filled included gift cards for groceries, gas cards, baby needs, medical expenses, funeral costs, and household needs.

Additionally, families at Me Fine's partner hospitals received **\$73,419 worth of in-kind donations**. These included toys, puzzles, games, art supplies, and other pediatric patient-specific items delivered to hospitals throughout the year, in addition to gifts distributed during Christmas in July and Hope for the Holidays.

Beads of Courage: BeadStrong

Long-time Me Fine supporters may already be familiar with Beads of Courage, the internationally-renowned program that enables pediatric patients to record, tell, and own their stories using colorful beads as meaningful symbols of courage and hope along their treatment journey. Me Fine sponsors Beads of Courage programs for patients in nine pediatric units across our three partner hospitals. But how can we celebrate the unique journey that caregivers experience during their child's treatment? Enter the BeadStrong parent program! Me Fine is proud to expand our sponsorship of Beads of Courage to include this arts-in-medicine supplement especially for caregivers to recognize their unique moments of courage and hope.

Emotional and Social Support Programs

Sensory Carts

The hospital can be a scary and anxietyproducing place for anyone. The bright fluorescent lights, constant beeping of equipment, and unfamiliar routines can be especially challenging for pediatric patients who have sensory processing issues or require sensory distractions to help manage their emotions in the moment. Hospital staff came to Me Fine with a request for toys and tools proven to soothe patients with a wide range of sensory differences. For example, "fidget" items, such as the Busy Fingers Marble Maze, an air-filled "wiggle seat", or Frik Frack Fidgets, offer an outlet for excess energy; Find-It Games and Sight & Sound Tubes help focus an active mind. Noise-reduction headphones, weighted blankets, and weighted stuffed animals provide sensations of safety and security, helping to calm anxiety. Liquid Motion bubblers and LED Light Projectors bring soothing visual fluidity to a sharp, stark, and scary hospital room. All of these tools in the hands of hospital staff can help de-escalate tense treatment situations and ensure the best possible outcomes—medically, emotionally, and psychologically—for the entire family system.

NICU Parent Education Sessions



Visiting your baby in the NICU can be an isolating experience: in the guiet and dim light, it's easy to feel alone, despite other bassinets and fellow parents just steps away. Me Fine recognizes the value of bringing caregivers together for mutual support and education on topics specific to **prematurity.** However, we also know that parents are focused so deeply on their little ones that they often only leave cribside to grab a guick meal. To help create that community of support, Me Fine sponsors weekly or monthly meals as an opportunity for caregivers to talk, share, and learn together. During these sessions, NICU staff provide education on topics such as "Keeping Germs Away" or "Self-care in the NICU" and answer common questions.

While countless organizations adopt families over the holiday season, very few keep their referral rosters open past Thanksgiving. Just as Me Fine serves as a safety net for families in crisis through our financial assistance program, our Hope for the Holidays program is designed to support families whose children receive a new diagnosis or are in medical crisis in the weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas. We call our donors for this program the "Dream Team" because of their dedication to fulfill the holiday wishes of these families on such a tight timeline. The award recognizes those who go above and beyond to help critically ill kids and families in ways aligning with with Me Fine's mission.

This year's event was a powerful testament to our community's shared values," said Colleen McGowan, Gala chair and board member.

More than 375 of our best friends filled the City Club in downtown Raleigh on October 27, raising more than \$220,000 for Me Fine families. Nurses explained that it was sometimes because the family couldn't afford to take the time off work and or travel to the hospital each day to be with their child. No family should ever have to choose between spending time with their sick child and keeping their lights on or paying their mortgage. That's why we support Me Fine.





In Their Own Words

"My name is Ashley. I have a seven-yearold boy named Levi. He has ALL leukemia. I also have four other children. Before Levi's sickness, our life was organized. We had schedules. Levi was a very active little boy: he ran, jumped, wrestled. But, since he has gotten sick, our lives have gotten off of schedule. Bed times are off. Everything has gone off-track. Now Levi is less active. His sickness has made a big impact on this family."

"I just told mom that this was taken care of and she said, 'Thank you SO much... You have no idea what this means to me!' Just wanted to pass this on. It was actually pretty much the same response as the mom you helped with car payments a couple of days ago"

Down Highway 15-501, Jenny J. found her son, Samuel J., admitted to UNC Children's Hospital for persistent asthma. Her sixyear-old experienced difficulty breathing for more than two weeks. This was Samuel's fourth hospitalization. The family hails from Dunn, North Carolina. Jenny and her family traveled for nearly 90 minutes one-way, when traffic was "normal", each time Samuel required medical intervention. Samuel's social worker referred his family to Me Fine for some assistance. The organization, because of our supporters, provided Jenny a \$200 grocery gift card in order to eliminate one more out-of-pocket expense weighing on the family.

In Their Own Words

Me Fine received this referral from Ronald McDonald House -- which has become an increasingly important partner as hospital social worker positions are cut or reduced. The mother of premature twin babies confided that her little ones were ready to come home, but they couldn't be discharged until the family had car seats. With two other young children at home and being in and out of work due to the twins' hospitalization, the family didn't know where they were going to get car seats or the money to pay for them. Me Fine shipped two infant car seats directly to them at Ronald McDonald House and the babies were scheduled to go home as soon as they arrived.
