We honor and affirm the lived experiences of the families we serve, in their own words whenever possible.


OUR MISSION:

2022 in Review





Families at our partner hospitals received \$48,339 of in-kind support, including gifts through our Hope for the Holidays programs, clothing and toiletries, toy deliveries to our partner hospitals, and program-specific items such as resource books and sensory kit additions.

Me Fine's Dream Team are supporters who "adopt" families around the holidays, helping to provide the exact needs families share for the season. **This year**, **the Dream Team helped support 54 families including 95 parents/caregivers, 157 children (patients and siblings), distributing 570 total gifts.**

Me Fine implemented a new program in 2022. Our NICU Caregiver Bags include items of comfort and self-care to help with a parent's overall coping during their baby's lengthy hospital admission. Prematurity is the most frequent diagnosis that Me Fine supports and each of our partner hospitals have a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.



Me Fine awarded the 2022 Hero For Life award to Child Life Specialist, Mary-Claire Derrickson from UNC Children's Hospital. Mary-Claire is the primary Child Life Specialist for the Pediatric Cardiac ICU and Sibling Support Coordinator. Her nominator Kelly Clark said, "She is a fierce advocate...the care she provides is incomparable." The Hero For Life award is Me Fine's Highest Honor, and recognizes those who go above and beyond to help critically ill kids and families in ways aligning with Me Fine's mission.



Additionally, Me Fine also acknowledged the major contributions of outgoing board member and past Board Chair Colleen McGowan with the Points of Light Presidential Service Award for her over 2,200 hours of service in the past 8 years. McGowan was the first person to receive the award from Me Fine, which included a congratulatory letter from the President of the United States.



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Patient Perspectives

E.BS Fayetteville, NC - diagnosis of prematurity, kidney failure, and congenital developmental complications which required a lengthy admission in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Me Fine helped provide much-needed assistance in utilities, gas, and grocery cards, essential baby needs including a crib, mattress and sheets to help create a safe home environment once the child was discharged. Me Fine also worked with a Dream Team donor to help support their family during the holidays. This helped the family tremendously during this significant hospitalization.

K.M Greensboro, NC - diagnosis of a congenital heart defect which required frequent weekly appointments for 6-9 months leading up to cardiac surgery. Me Fine provided much needed assistance with gas cards and transportation assistance such as Uber gift cards to help the family get to and from appointments and hospitalizations, and a phone with video capability to have reliable communication and frequent telehealth visits with their treatment team. This made a significant impact on compliance with treatment and preparing the family successfully for surgery.

C.M Wilmington, NC – diagnosis of Metastatic Osteosarcoma which treatment required frequent appointments and multiple-day hospitalizations while the family lived greater than 3 hours away from the hospital. Me Fine provided vital assistance with several utility bills and rent for their home. Me Fine also provided significant transportation assistance for the patient and family to get to the hospital for a major surgery. Without this assistance, this patient's treatment schedule would have been negatively impacted and they would not have been able to complete this muchneeded surgery.
