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Letter from the Executive Director

As a parent, I routinely find myself aghast at the disappearance of time. Toddlers become pre-teens, January becomes November, you know the drill. One of the heaviest experiences of that kind hits this year as Me Fine turns TWENTY YEARS OLD.

When Lori Lee went through the heart breaking loss of her little boy, her courage and focus on the present likely prevented her from ever thinking that her vision would still be a reality two decades later. (Though knowing her, I'm absolutely certain that she knew Folden's spirit would live on in many different ways, including Me Fine's work.)

Despite the growing pains of a small nonprofit, the changes in the healthcare landscape, a global pandemic, and whatever else the universe has thrown at Me Fine, I've come to realize that doing good never gets old. Our drive to meet families where they are and offload some of the burdens that weigh so heavily on them is just as strong today as it was the first time Lori decided to do something about it. Roughly one-third of all nonprofits close within 10 years of operations. Because you've been in lock step with us doing good since day one, we're able to continue to be a reliable resource for our neighbors and their kids when they need us most.



Program Spotlight



Sensory Resources, Emergency Clothing, and Toiletry Kits

Since 2020, Me Fine has been providing sensory resources such as stress balls, fidget items, weighted blankets, and more to help decrease anxiety and improve comfort during a child's overwhelming treatment course. Me Fine has also provided emergency clothing items and toiletry kits to help meet essential needs during a hospitalization and reduce stress for a family during a child's treatment. In 2023, we received consistent requests from our hospital partners to restock these items on a monthly basis. These resources have helped support patients and families throughout all units and clinics at each of our hospital partners. Some of our hospital partner staff have shared some amazing feedback about these essential programs and resources Me Fine provides.



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"I just needed to tell you how incredibly helpful it was on Tuesday night to have the Me Fine shower kits! I had a family who's child was unexpectedly and emergently transferred to the pediatric ICU. The mom was incredibly anxious (understandably so) and after we got her child settled and we explained the plan I asked her if there was anything I could do for her. She asked was there any chance we had any shampoo and conditioner to shower. It was so nice to be able to have the pre-made shower kits available. I've worked at other hospitals before where giving families this simple request was never so easy. She expressed enormous gratitude for the supplies, and it was amazing to be able to give this mom the ability to care for herself during this hard time. Please pass my thanks along to the Me Fine family!! These kits are wonderful for families and such a time saver for nurses."

"Our behavioral health population has greatly benefited from the sensory kits Me Fine provided to WakeMed. "You literally made my dreams come true! We got it (the quad stroller) yesterday & we had our first stroller ride together as a family!!! My child's medical equipment fit perfectly & I can't explain how bizarrely happy she was! I'm not sure if it was her with her siblings or just being where the action is! But thank you!!"

Mom of quadruplets- patient spent 8 months in the NICU and had significant medical equipment at discharge and other 3 siblings spent 2-3 months each in the NICU. Me Fine provided a quad stroller for the family that they could otherwise not afford.

In planning for their child's bone marrow transplant, this family worked with their social worker to line up funding support from several sources to assist with bills that they knew they would not be able to pay during the transplant. They began the process in March to request funds from another organization and filled out and submitted paperwork to have a check sent to cover their car insurance for two months. The first check sent was lost in the mail, a replacement was returned without being processed, and a third attempt would have taken 10 more days. By this time (early May), the car insurance had lapsed — leading the vehicle lien holder to disable the car remotely. Clearly, the family was panicked, in addition to being more than a bit frustrated...

Enter Me Fine. The social worker said, "I knew Me Fine was the only organization that could take care of a request on such short notice." Within 30 minutes, and for just \$450, we were able to pay the balance owed over the phone to restore their insurance and cover the family for the duration of treatment. (Financial assistance provided for a family during their child's medical crisis)

"As a parent it was extremely difficult navigating a medical crisis for my child in the hospital. We had a whole medical team supporting and helping us. Unfortunately being isolated from our family we did not have any support for our healthy child who had to navigate being away from his whole family through this ordeal. Having support and a safe space for the sibling to feel connected, special and heard is just as important as taking care of our medically-sick child. Thanks to the program offered by Me Fine, our healthy child was able to have some normalcy through our medical tsunami."


